Study Introduction and Overview

This three-part study guide on Prophecy and Fulfilment is introduced to encourage the reader of scripture to see God's foreknowledge in the birth, life and ministry and death of Jesus. This is an appropriate study focus during Advent as we encounter so many prophecies being fulfilled at the time of Jesus' birth.

These lists of prophecies are not intended to be exhaustive. There are over 300 messianic prophecies found in scripture. As we re-read the familiar Christmas stories and sing our favourite carols, this study will help us gain a deeper understanding of the prophecies of Jesus birth, life and ministry, and death.

As you read through these scripture texts consider the accuracy of the prophecies, written so many centuries before they were fulfilled. God has written His story and it was played out in fine detail in the life of Jesus. God's plan for the redemption and restoration of His creation will continue to completion, uninterrupted by any scheme of Satan or humans. We have confidence that all the prophecies yet unfulfilled will take place with the same accuracy according to God's perfect timetable.

Study Session 1 – Jesus' Birth
